LAS VEGAS (KSNV) — The Israeli government official charged with a child sex crime as part of a Nevada law enforcement sting operation pleaded not guilty.

Appearing via video in Clark County District Court on Monday, Tom Alexandrovich entered his plea to one count of luring a child with the intent to engage in sexual conduct, records show.

admitted to being "embarrassed for being arrested" but told police the person with whom he was communicating said she was 18.

Records showed Alexandrovich, who works for the Israeli government, was released after posting \$10,000 bail and without having to appear before a judge.

The U.S. State Department denied having any involvement in Alexandrovich's release. He was able to return to Israel and [appeared for past Henderson Justice Court hearings](#) virtually.

Hebron housing residents say support services eliminated

LAS VEGAS (KSNV) — Residents at Hebron Transitional Housing say they were met with empty shelves and locked doors after a recent change in management eliminated key services many depended on to survive.

Up until last week, the property was operated by Caridad Charities. [Due to funding issues, the nonprofit relinquished the property](#), which houses low-income residents, fixed-income seniors and veterans.

Susan Reams, who has lived in the community since August, said the impact was immediate.

“*It was just gone, gone. G-O-N-E, gone, Reams said.*”

Residents say one of the first changes under the new management was the removal of the community food pantry, along with the clothing closet and access to the community kitchen.

“They moved in last week, and one of the first things they did was eliminate the food pantry, then they took away the clothing closet, and the community kitchen is no longer accessible, and all of this is causing a tremendous hardship on the residents,” Reams said.

Many who live at Hebron rely on limited incomes, she said, and rising grocery prices have only made matters worse.

“Many of these people just have limited sources of income, and they're working, but grocery bills have gone sky high. So we relied on the Three Square truck to come and curb that cost of

Reams said residents were not given advance notice about the pantry's closure.

“They haven't said anything. They're pretty no-nonsense, and they just said it will be eliminated. No discussion with the residents, no prior notice,” she said.

News 3 reached out to the new owners of Hebron Transitional Housing to ask why the pantry and other services were removed but did not receive a response Monday evening.

In the meantime, Reams is organizing a food drive to help her neighbors.

“We're reaching out for help to try to see what we can do, and I've organized a food drive so we could really use a helping hand in the situation,” she said.
